



Table Top Mountain is owned and operated by the Paterson family. We hope you enjoy the time you have put aside to take in some of the natural beauty of this area. Our aim is to keep this 500 hectares of land in its natural state for this and future generations to appreciate.

We have built approximately 20 kilometres of walking tracks and along the way you will see a variety of box, gum, stringybark, kurrajong and acacia trees. In Spring and Summer there is a flush of wildflowers.

Some fauna you may come across are kangaroos, wallabies, echidnas, goannas, snakes, lizards, wombats and possums. The Yambla range, which our property is part of, is an uplift formed 300 million years ago and the rock is mostly conglomerate.

A bird survey has been carried out by an ornithologist who identified the 140 bird species found on the mountain. We hope you spot many of these on your walk and enjoy the thrill of seeing some beautiful and fascinating native creatures.

We ask you to remain within our fenced block and park in the designated areas. Persons entering the property do so at their own risk to themselves and their possessions.
